

Katherine is committed to inspire the next generation to fight for children. She leads our social media team and is spearheading our sexual exploitation prevention course that is anticipated in fall 2021.



 COVID Emergency Response with AusCam Freedom Project (AFP)

April 2, 2020 | Phnom Penh, Cambodia
We directly funded relief packages that provided
20 families food, hygiene supplies, and mobile
phone credit top ups for high-risk girls to access
support and crisis intervention early in the
pandemic.

Rise Up For Children Rally

July 30, 2020 | Toronto, Canada
On World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, we successfully hosted a rally that gathered 80+ participants from Toronto and the GTA to urge our leaders to implement policies that safeguard children from sexual exploitation in Canada and abroad. Thank you to Toronto City

• Bloom House Grand Opening

September 1, 2020 | Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam We opened our first semi-independent transition home for girls aged 16+, where they can blossom into self-reliant young women by receiving vocational training, life skills/relationship counseling, financial literacy and English language lessons, and more!


 The Shine Center Partnership with AusCam Freedom Project






TOTAL REVENUE: \$99,913







REVIEW ENGAGEMENT:

REVIEW ENGAGEMENT REPORT

To the Board of Directors One Body Village

I have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of One Body Village that comprise the balance sheet as at March 31, 2021, and the statement of income, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Practitioner's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying financial statements based on my review. I conducted my review in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements, which require me to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted standards for review engagements is a limited assurance engagement. The practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making inquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less in extent than, and vary in nature from, those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Accordingly, I do not express an audit opinion on these financial statements.

Conclusion

Based on my review, nothing has come to my attention that causes me to believe that these financial statements do not present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of One Body Village as at March 31, 2021, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Notes to Financial Statements

March 31, 2021

1. Purpose and nature of the organization

One Body Village is committed to combatting child sexual exploitation through awareness, advocacy, capacity building and empowerment. The mission is to:

- Improve the lives of at-risk and affected children of sexual exploitation with shelter, education, medical and behavioural care, psychological counseling and vocational training; and
- Combat child sexual exploitation by educating and empowering communities to be catalysts for change.

One Body Village provides shelter, rehabilitation, reintegration, prevention, and advocacy services to victims of sexual exploitation.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Presentation

These financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO) applied within the framework of the accounting policies summarized below.

Fund Accounting

These financial statements include the following funds:

Unrestricted Fund

The Unrestricted Fund accounts for One Body's Village program delivery, development and administrative activities. This fund reports unrestricted resources. Unrestricted Funds includes the Operating Fund made available for immediate purposes and use of the Operating Funds is at the discretion of the Board.

Reserve Fund

The reserve fund was established in 2020 by the Board of Directors to ensure the long-term viability of the organization by enabling the organization to sustain severe fluctuations in income. The reserve fund is an internal restriction and the use of the funds is at the discretion of the board of directors. The fund is not intended to replace a permanent loss of funds or eliminate an ongoing budget gap and any amounts used will be replenished within a year.

Restricted Fund

The Restricted Fund accounts for One Body Village resources that are to be used for specific purposes as specified by the donor. This includes program delivery.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

Revenue Recognition

One Body Village follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions, events and grants. Under this method, unrestricted contributions, events and grants are recognized as received or receivable if the amount to be received is reasonably estimable and collection is reasonably assured.

Cash

Cash represents cash on hand and cash in the bank.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian ASNPO requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates and may have an impact on future periods.

Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value when acquired or issued. In subsequent periods, equities traded in an active market and derivatives are reported at fair value, with any unrealized gains and losses reported in operations. In addition, all guaranteed investment certificates have been designated to be in the fair value category, with gains and losses reported in operations. All other financial instruments are reported at cost or amortized cost less impairment, if applicable. Financial assets are tested for impairment when changes in circumstances indicate the asset could be impaired. Transaction costs on the acquisition, sale or issue of financial instruments are expensed for those items remeasured at fair value at each statement of financial position date and charged to the financial instrument for those measured at amortized cost.

3. Cash

The cash balance, at March 31, 2021, includes US-dollar cash totaling US\$5,678 (2020 – US\$6,788)
